DIY Laundry Softener

- 6 cups hot water {I used hot tap water, but you can boil the water as well}
- 2 cups white vinegar

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• 1 bottle of conditioner {any conditioner will do. I picked one that smells great & that's cheap!} (Suave, etc.)

In a bowl, mix the hot water and full bottle of conditioner. Stir until completely mixed & dissolved.


After that pour in the vinegar and mix it all together.

After that pour your laundry softener into the container of your choice. A large mouth Mason Jar works great. I use about 6 tablespoons, but you can use the amount that works for you.



DIY Laundry Soap

- 1. One 4lbs 12oz box of Borax. You can use 2 smaller boxes. {Found in Laundry aisle}
- 2. Three bars of Fels-Naptha soap. You can use any soap of your choice. {Found in Laundry aisle}
- 3. one four-pound box of arm & hammer baking soda. {Not pictured here} {Laundry aisle}
- 4. one box of arm & hammer super washing soda {laundry aisle}
- 5. four pounds of Oxy Clean {one small/one large container/laundry aisle}
- 6. Laundry softener crystals for scent. You can mix these in to your laundry detergent or add them to your loads as needed.



- 1. Grate the Fels-Naptha bars into a bowl
- 2. Dump Fels-Naptha into a large container {I used a 5-gallon pale with a garbage bag inside}
- 3. Mix all other ingredients into the bucket & shake it all up together.
- 4. Place into container of your choice.

The laundry soap can get hard because moisture gets into the container. To prevent this from happening add a cheese cloth with rice inside to absorb any moisture. You can also add silica packets as well. Rice works wonders.
